

Electronic governance or e-governance is inclusion of information and communication technology (ICT) for delivering government services, exchange of information communication transactions, integration of various stand-alone systems and services between government-to-customer (G2C), government-to-business (G2B), government-to-government (G2G) as well as back office processes and interactions within the entire government framework.

e-governance ensure transparency and accountability.

The major intent of E-Governance is to provide a SMARRT Government. SMARRT refers to Simple, Moral, Accountable, Responsive, Responsible and Transparent Government.

- □ S The use of ICT brings simplicity in governance through electronic documentation, online submission, online service delivery, etc.
- □ M It brings Morality to governance as immoralities like bribing, red-tapism, etc. are eliminated.
- □ R Due to reduced paperwork and increased communication speeds and decreased communication time, the Government agencies become responsive.

□ R – Technology can help convert an irresponsible Government Responsible. Increased access to information makes more informed citizens. And these empowered citizens make a responsible Government.	
□ T – With increased morality, online availability of information and reduced red-tapism the process of governance becomes transparent leaving no room for the Government to conceal any information from the citizens.

What does it call for?

Why has CCIT been blocked?

- US+allies: Concerns over definitions of terrorism, including acts by US soldiers in international interventions without UN mandate
- Latin American countries: Concerns over international humanitarian laws and HR being ignored
- OIC: Concerns that convention will be used to target Pakistan, and restrict rights of self-determination groups in Palestine, Kashmir etc

- ☐ A global issue: Terrorism is a persistent global issue that knows no border, nationality, or religion.


Effectiveness of the UNSC counter terrorism committee and its associated bodies in addressing and mitigating this threat.

The United Nations Security Council's (UNSC) Counter-Terrorism Committee (CTC) is a committee that addresses the threat of terrorism. The CTC was established in 2001 in response to the 9/11 terror attacks. The CTC's work includes:
Criminalizing terrorist offenses
Strengthening international cooperation
Countering the use of new and emerging technologies
Addressing the threat of foreign terrorist fighters
Promoting a whole-of-society approach
Integrating gender into counter-terrorism
The CTC is made up of all 15 Security Council members, including five permanent members and ten non-permanent members. The non-permanent members are elected for two-year terms by the General Assembly.

Global cooperation against terrorism is important because it helps to prevent and combat terrorism, and to ensure that the rule of law and human rights are respected.

Preventing and combating terrorism, Respecting human rights and the rule, Building state capacity, Sharing information, Strengthening law enforcement.

Geo-political and geostrategic importance of Maldives for India

- □ Strategic Location: Located south of India, the Maldives holds immense strategic importance in the <u>Indian</u> <u>Ocean</u>, acting as a gateway to the Arabian Sea and beyond.
- ☐ This allows India to monitor maritime traffic and enhance regional security.
- □ Despite its small size, the Maldives is currently being wooed by a number of developed and developing countries. Because of Strategic Importance of the Geographic Location of the Maldives with respect to Key International Shipping Lanes (ISLs).



Implement and enforce regulations on private healthcare costs and quality standards.
Expand coverage of health insurance schemes like Ayushman Bharat to reduce out-of-pocket expenses.
Develop public-private partnerships with robust oversight to leverage private sector efficiency while ensuring public welfare.

- ➤ Establish robust monitoring and evaluation frameworks to assess the effectiveness of healthcare programs and identify areas for improvement. Example: The National Health Management Information System (NHMIS) collects data on healthcare services, helping policymakers make informed decisions.
